Step Seven

Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.

Five years ago and some change, I sat newly sober with my sponsor and he indicated we would meet once a week and I could and should call him frequently. Upon my agreement, we then dove head-long into step one and with great shame and fear I described in honest detail all of my tales of debauchery and defilement that summed up my powerlessness and unmanageable life. At the end of our session with a great glow of authentic gratitude, my sponsor thanked me for meeting with him and added how inspired he was from our time together.

No one had ever been so warmly enthusiastic about meeting with me let alone acquire any inspiration; surely he was just being over enthusiastically polite or just trying to boost my weary spirits. I accepted his appreciation, but really did not believe he derived anything of substance in meeting with me.

After each and every one of our sponsor/sponsee meetings he thanked me profusely and affectionately. After being around AA for a few months I began to experience the warmth and love and began to believe he was getting something out of our meetings, but it could be nothing like the lifesaving experiences I was realizing. I had no idea!

At about two years of sobriety



I began to get my first sponsees and like Wilson, none of them stayed sober for long and I would confer with my sponsor of these failures and he immediately proclaim success and ask whether I drank.

Over the past three years I have had some 20 or so sponsees and some of the guys are staying sober and I have received more than I could have ever imagined! Learning that I am merely a trusted servant, it is my good pleasure to give without expectation of repayment, appreciation, or even recognition. If I avail myself humbly to these men and open up my past as the path to my present, hope lights their eyes. When I openly reveal all the dark places of my past without reservation great bonds of trust are forged. I find that I lose myself in what I suppose I would call being a channel of His message and am astonished at what comes out of my mouth. We both needed to hear these very things as my understanding of

the process grows, and the nature of the Source becomes increasingly apparent. As we take each step our imaginations become fired and the passion grows—we become capable to bring to bear His strength that we make another day free from alcohol and its torment.

Above all, I get to see right before my very eyes the hand of our Maker take these men and transform them. I once had a belief that kept me sober, but now I have a knowing that His grace and love are as sure as the breath from my lips. And the power – I have seen the lifeless stares of the bewildered transformed into warm smiles and eager feet in search to give away what has been given them.

I cannot thank these men enough for giving me the great honor to help and thus, my entire state of spiritual being has been wiped and created anew, as real as a pinch to the arm. Grateful, yes, life saving for me—you better believe it!

We think that each group should soon achieve this ideal; that any public solicitation of funds using the name of Alcoholics Anonymous is highly dangerous, whether by groups, clubs, hospitals, or other outside agencies; that acceptance of large gifts from any source, or of contributions carrying any obligation whatever, is unwise. Then, too, we view with much concern those A.A. treasuries which continue, beyond prudent reserves, to accumulate funds for no stated purpose. Experience has often warned us that nothing can so surely destroy our spiritual heritage as futile disputes over property, money, and authority.
