Problems of money, property, and authority may easily divert us from our primary spiritual aim.

Therefore, it has proved wise to keep the operation of the facility completely separate from that of any A.A. group, and to keep "A.A." or terms like "Twelfth Step" out of the name.

We found that there are all kinds of goals, motives and ambitions...and the

good name of A.A. could be smeared!

A.A. members employed by outside agencies "wear two hats"—but Tradition Six cautions any such members against wearing both at once! On the job, they may be alcoholism counselors: they are not "A.A. counselors." At meetings they're just A.A.'s, not alcoholism experts.

There are two major danger areas. But

our course has been charted and the hazards clearly marked. If we steer clear of <u>them</u>, we should have smooth sailing...

"Affiliation of A.A. groups with anything outside A.A."

and "any activity that would harm A.A. as a whole."

Tradition Six

Problems of money, property, and authority may easily divert us from our primary spiritual aim. We think, therefore, that any considerable property of genuine use to A. A. should be separately incorporated and managed, thus dividing the material from the spiritual. An A.A. group, as such, should never go into business. Secondary aids to A.A., such as clubs or hospitals which require much property or administration, ought to be incorporated and so set apart that if necessary, they can be freely discarded by the groups. Hence such facilities ought not to use the A.A. name. Their management should be the sole responsibility of those people who financially support them. For clubs, A.A. managers are usually preferred. But hospitals, as well as other places of recuperation, ought to be well outside A.A.-and medically supervised. While an A.A. group may cooperate with anyone, such cooperation ought never go so far as affiliation or endorsement, actual or implied. An A.A. group can bind itself

to no one.


